471.345 UNIFORM MUNICIPAL CONTRACTING LAW

§Subdivision 15.Cooperative Purchasing

A municipality may contract for the purchase of supplies, materials, or equipment if the purchase is through a national municipal association's purchasing alliance or cooperative created by a joint powers agreement that purchases items from more than one source on the basis of competitive bids or competitive quotations.



Cooperative Contract Due Diligence

Considerations

- Conformance with state or local law
- Review specifications, price, terms and condition
- Verify application and eligibility
- Compare multiple contracts
- Negotiate with large quantities

Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) Required



- > Statutory authority for two government units to share power.
- ➤ JPA required to utilize Washington State cooperative.
- > JPA requires Council approval.

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Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute Joint Powers Cooperative Agreement #221002 with the Washington State Department of Enterprise Services ("DES") to allow the Council to utilize their master contracts for cooperative purchasing of rolling stock.

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
