Capital Program Principles

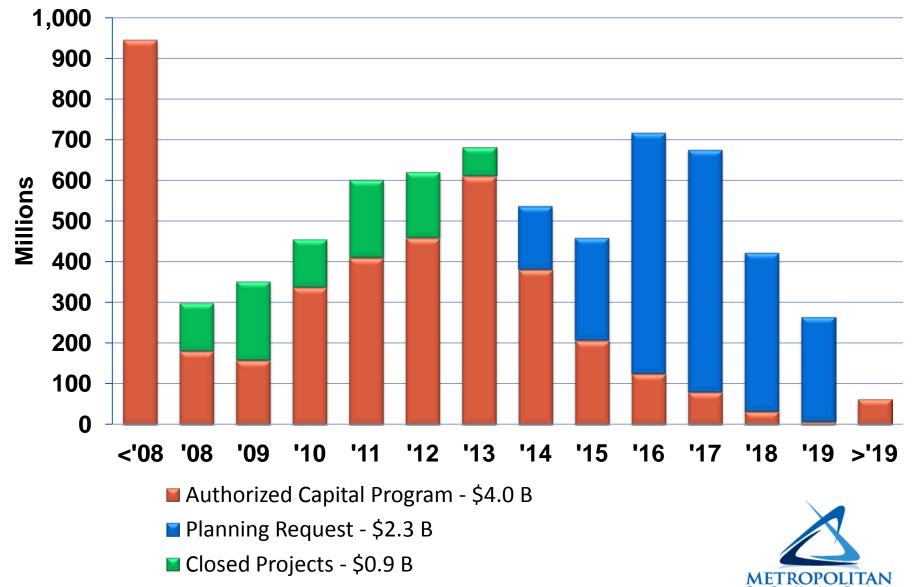
- Organization-wide, unified plan

- Contingent on obtaining capital and operating funding

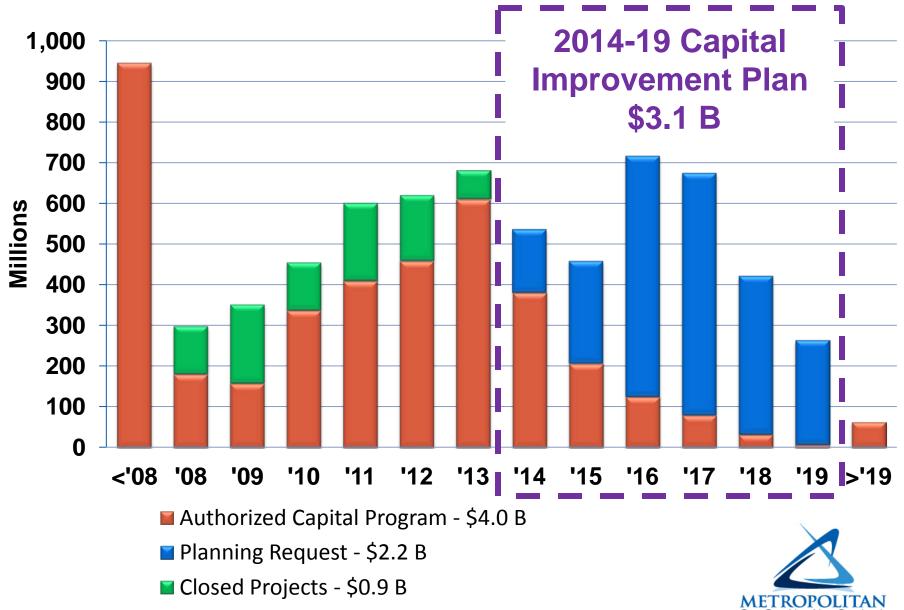


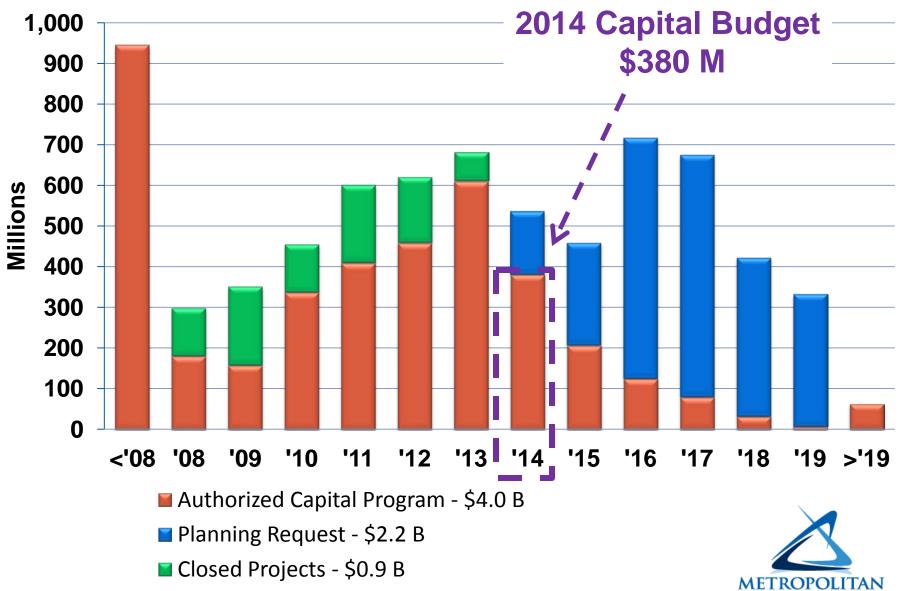

- Add calendar year 2019 to CIP









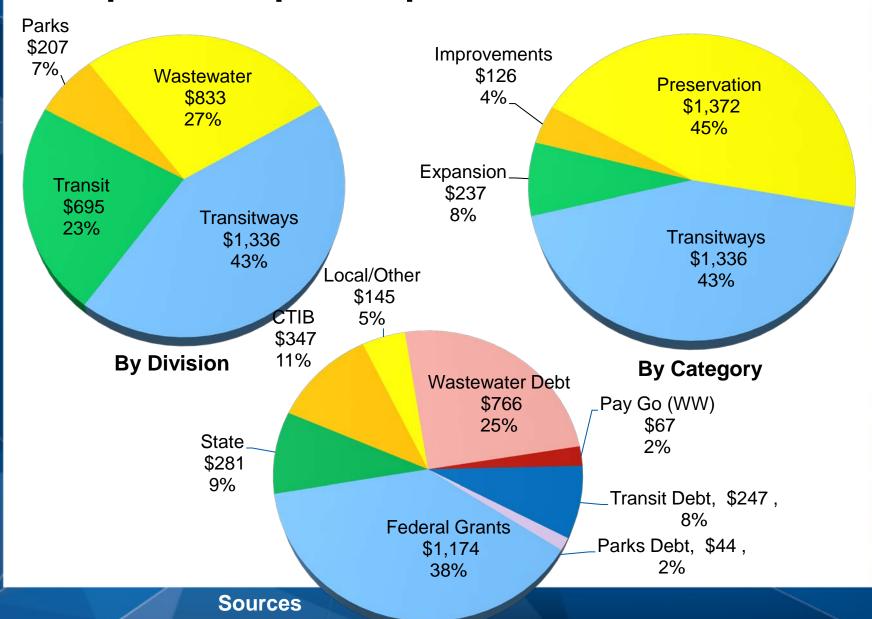

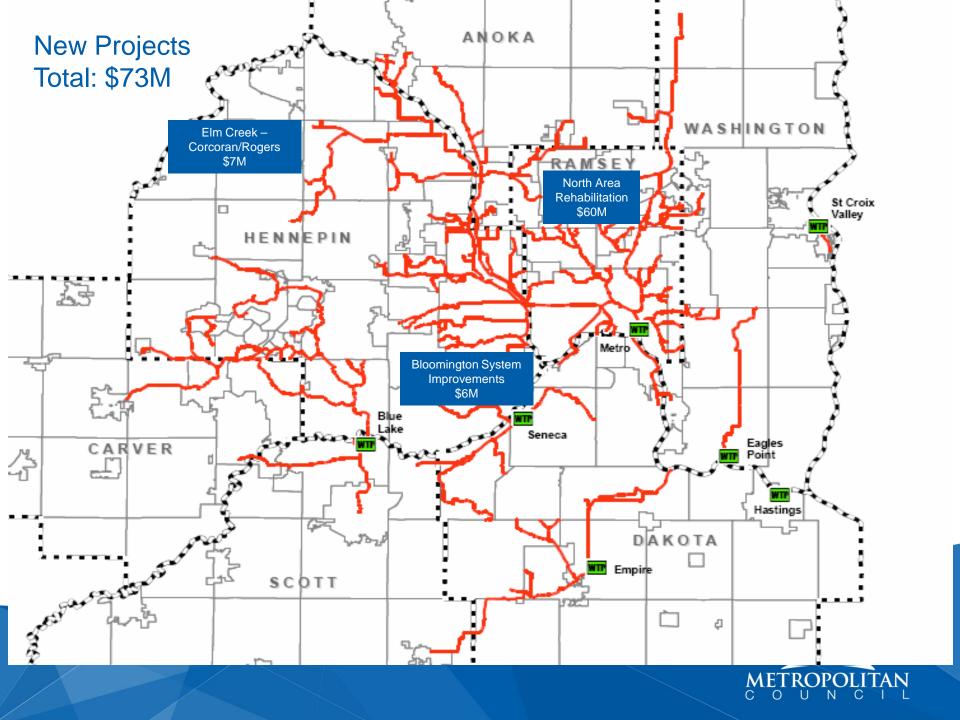


Proposed Capital Improvement Plan - \$3.1 B

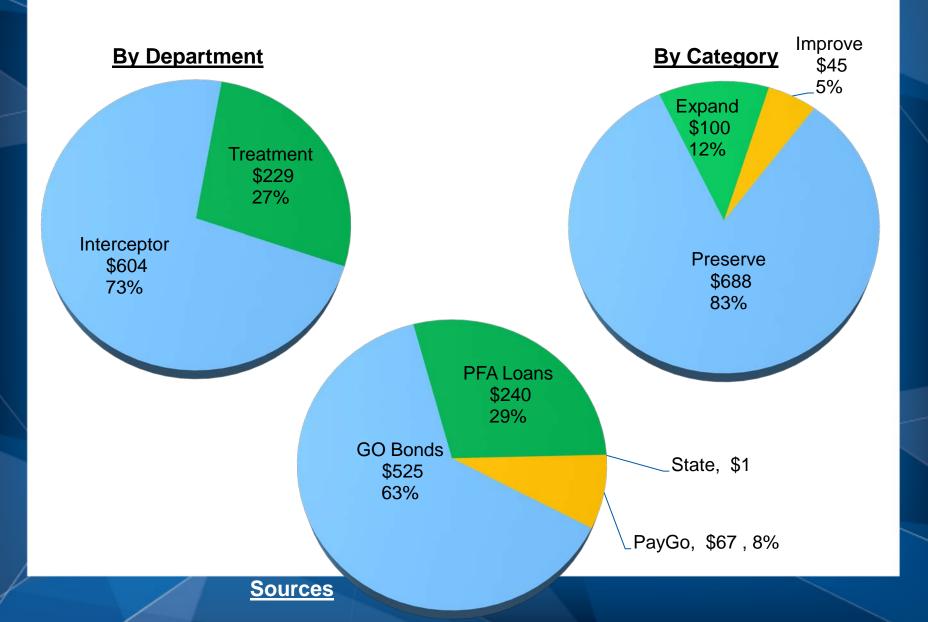

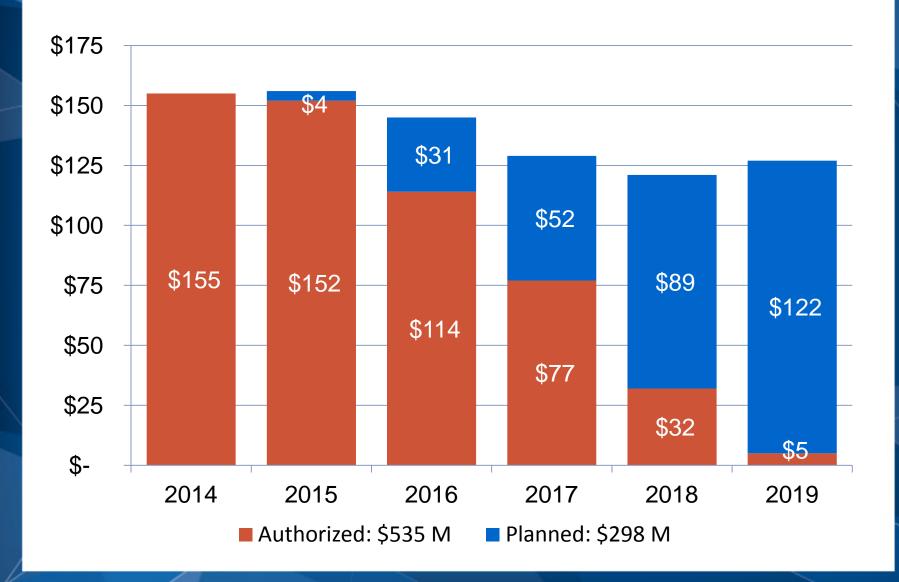




Proposed 2014-19 CIP: \$833.0 M

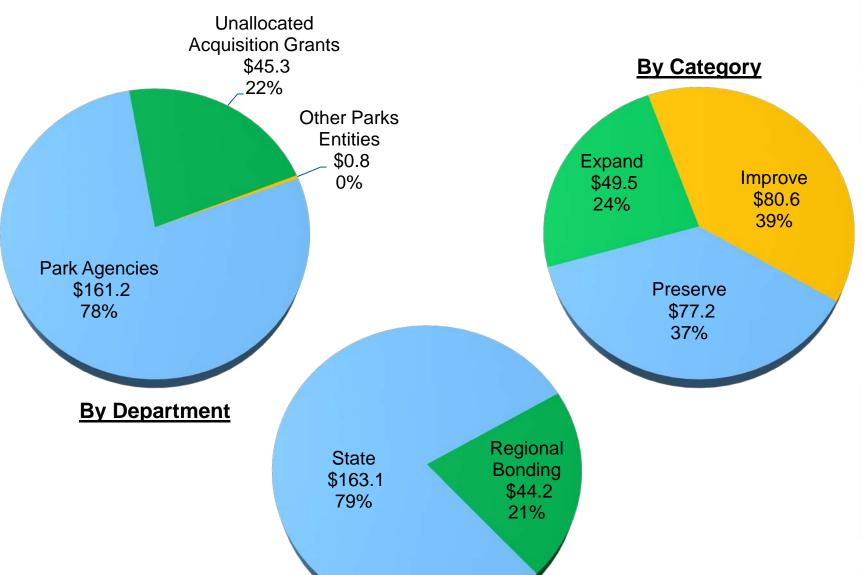


2014-19 Capital Program Highlights

 - \$10.5M / \$7M changed to \$11M / \$7.33M

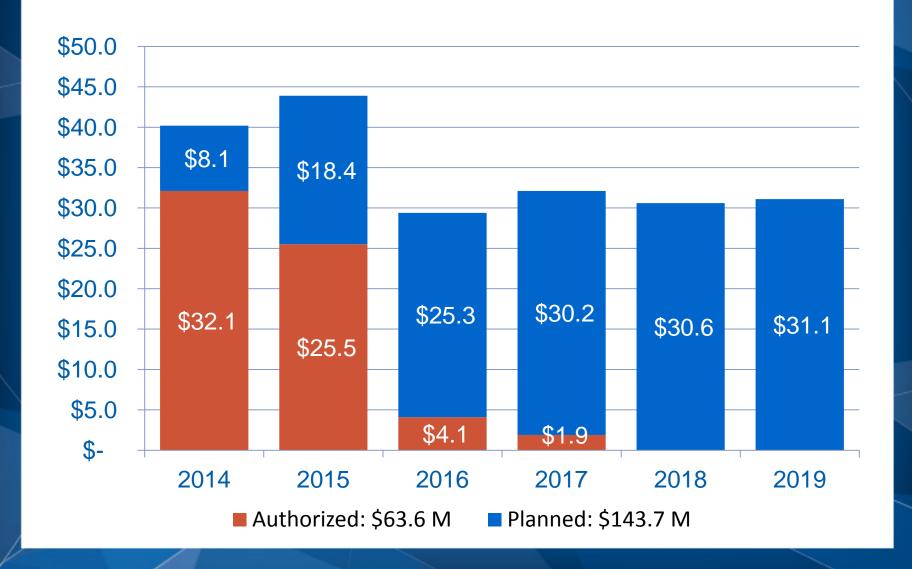


Parks 2014-19 CIP: \$207.3 M

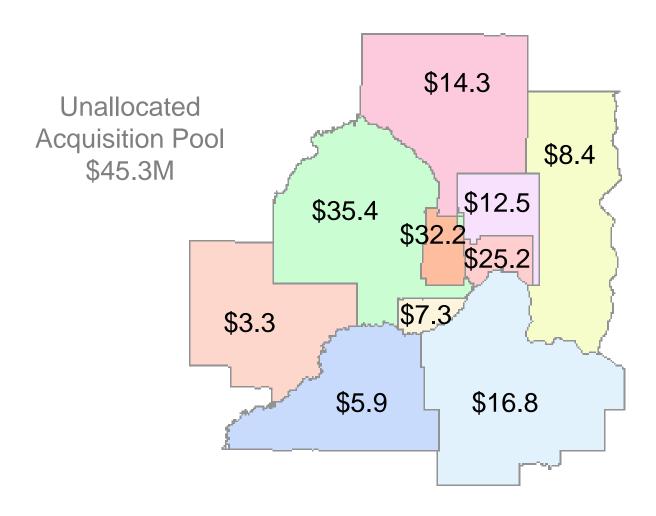

Transit 2014-19 CIP Highlights

CIP Priorities

- Capital projects require longer range views
- Maintain current system
 - Replace vehicles per fleet management plans
 - Maintain and repair existing facilities
- Build transitways / expand bus system
 - Be positioned to meet future customer ridership and service demands
- Total 2014-2019 CIP of \$2.03B (includes CCLRT & SWLRT)
- Total 2014-2019 CIP of \$761.4M (without CCLRT & SWLRT)





Transit 2014-19 CIP Impacts & Pressures

- Federal funding reflects MAP 21 (0-1.5% increase per year)
- Regional Transit capital increasing 1% per year
- Construction/bus inflation 2.5%-3.5% per year
- Impact of added rail maintenance needs
- Bus system growth vs. vehicle storage capacity
- Growth in Unmet Needs from \$546M to \$1.75B and includes:
 - Unfunded 1% fleet expansion
 - Support/customer facilities
 - BRT transitways (arterial & highway)
 - Regional park & ride expansion
 - Bottineau LRT (Blue Line Extension)

Metro Transit 2014-19 CIP Highlights

Existing/ Completed Projects

- Completion of Green Line construction with revenue service 2014
- Southwest Corridor LRT construction at \$1.25B
- Completion of new Transit Police facility
- Completion of Target Field Station
- Replace 258 buses, facility energy enhancements, ADA and signage improvements and technology upgrades
- LRV overhauls (both Type 1 & Type 2)





Metro Transit 2014-19 CIP Highlights

New Projects

- Partial funding for two BRT lines: Snelling Ave. BRT and West 7th BRT
- Begin Heywood II Garage design
- Downtown East area enhancements
- Northstar locomotive/passenger car overhauls
- Technology
 - Replacement Real Time signs
 - Next generation fare collection devices

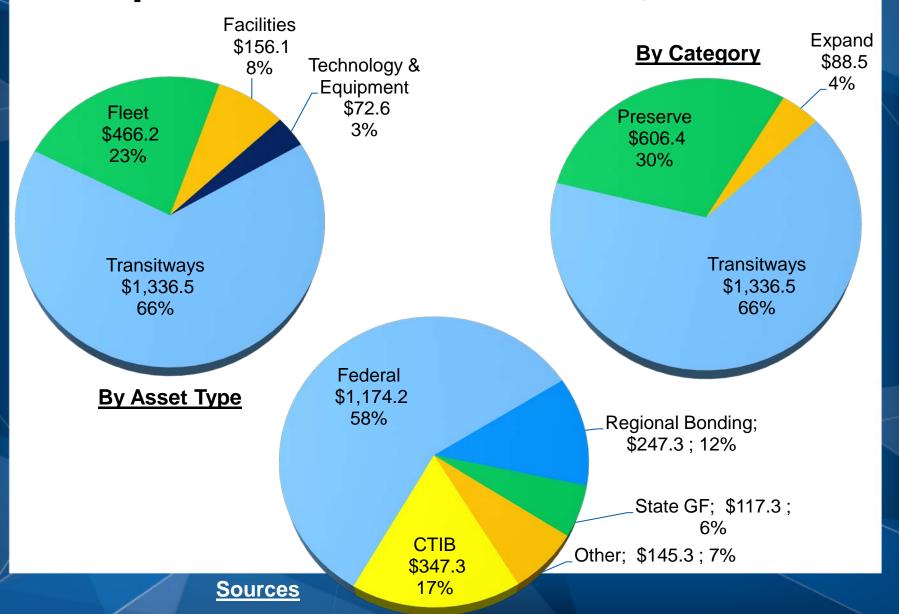

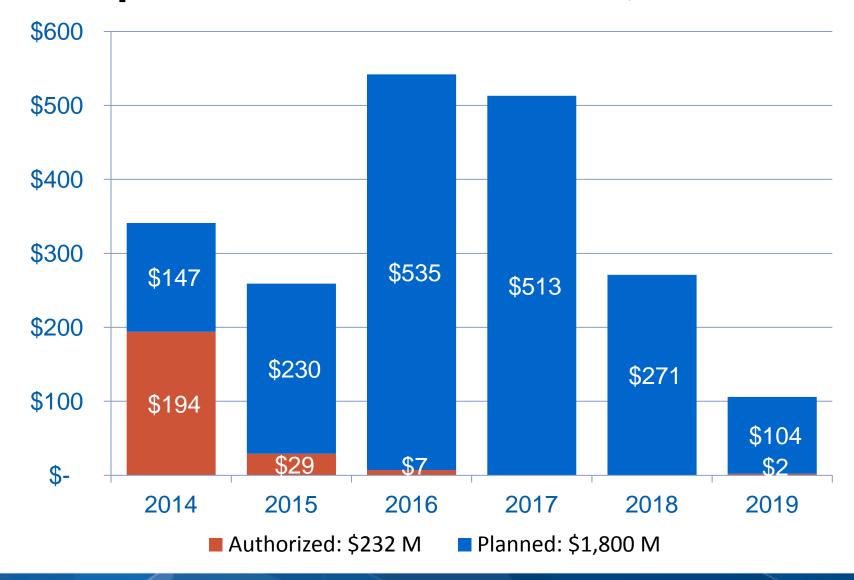
