#### **Proposed Action**

The Metropolitan Council authorizes its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute cooperative agreements between the Council and the cities of Excelsior, Greenwood and Shorewood, for the construction of and services related to the construction of the Excelsior Forcemain, MCES Project No. 802850.

#### **Background**

As part of the planned construction of a parallel force main through the cities of Excelsior, Greenwood and Shorewood, the MCES has been working with the cities to construct street and utility improvements as part of the MCES construction contract. These cities also will be providing services such as easement acquisition assistance and plan review for the Council. The construction will be performed in two contracts, one in 2013 and another in 2014.

The cities will provide the designs for the improvements and the Council's architect/engineer will incorporate the designs into combined contract documents. The city and interceptor work will be bid together by MCES. The Council will be reimbursed for construction costs associated with city work.

#### Rationale

Two of the three agreements will exceed \$250,000 in cost to the Council. Concurrent construction will reduce the duration and amount of disruption to the communities and is of significant value to the cities.

Reguested Amount: \$1,600,000 (total for all three agreements)
