Background

- Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) Mitigation Program has been in place since 2005
- Previous task forces met in 2003 and 2004 and in 2009 and 2010
- Recommendations provided by previous task forces have been incorporated into the existing program.
- Approximately 50 communities have participated in the program.

Task Force Assignment

- Review existing program, progress made, and recommend changes to the I/I program.
- Identify technical, political, financial, challenges of addressing private property I/I sources; recommend program modifications.

Recommended Action

That the Metropolitan Council approve Chair Duininck's recommendation to establish an Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) Task Force to evaluate and make specific recommendations about the existing Ongoing I/I Reduction Program, and to discuss, study and recommend programmatic changes in order to address private property sources of I/I in the metropolitan area. Furthermore, that the proposed members be appointed with Council Member Sandy Rummel as Chair of the Task Force.
