Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and award a contract with RailWorks Track Systems, Inc in an amount of \$1,100,000 to provide on-call track maintenance to the Blue and Green Lines for a period of five years, November 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020.

Background

A formal bid was issued August 5, 2016 for On-Call Track Maintenance. Bids were due on September 06, 2016. One responsive bid was received from RailWorks Track Systems, Inc in the amount of \$678,653.60. Procurement determined that there was adequate competition and no indication the specifications were restrictive.

The full dollar value of the CIM is requested to be awarded to this contract at \$1,100,000. This is due to an unknown number of service failures and additional maintenance required. Five year bid forms were not meant to be an all-inclusive representation of track maintenance and costs but a means to compare costs and hold contractors accountable for pricing.

The contract will be authorized with a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,100,000.

Rationale

Professional services contracts in excess of \$500,000 require Council approval.

Funding

Project funds are available through local and federal funding.
