
- "...there is little evidence that compliance with this requirement has led to successful alignment of the housing element of comprehensive plans and school district policies."



Key insights: How does school planning and city planning differ?

- Different geographical boundaries and populations served
- School planning focuses on the next five years; city planning looks out much farther
- School planning focuses on single family housing; city planning focuses on multiple housing types



Key insights: Where do school planning and city planning align?

- Iterative nature of residential development and school enrollment
- Comprehensive Plan Updates contain valuable information for school planners





Key insights: where are there opportunities?

- Schools may benefit from longer range planning
- Schools may benefit from more timely updates on current developments
- Schools and cities may benefit from more robust communication around potential school construction and closings
- Cities may benefit from unique information school districts have about their community
