**Subject:** Construction Contract for Bloomington Interceptor Rehabilitation

#### Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to award and execute a contract for construction of the Bloomington Interceptor Rehabilitation, Project No. 808060, Contract 16P079, with Geislinger and Sons, Inc. for their low responsive and responsible bid of \$5,702,756.02.

#### Summary of Committee Discussion/Questions

Pipes were constructed in 1960-61. The requested amount represents the construction contract and the remainder of the funds are used for design and land acquisition activities.

Construction will begin in 2016 and cured in place lining can be performed in the winter months. Areas that need asphalt restoration will be performed when temperatures are warm.

**Motion to approve the proposed action was made, seconded, and passed unanimously.**

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### Background

Inspection of this section of Interceptor 3-BN-499 has resulted in a determination that rehabilitation is necessary to restore the structural integrity and to avoid the eventual collapse of the Interceptor.

Three (3) bids, ranging from \$5,702,756.02 to \$6,473,800, were received and opened on June 21, 2016. The low bid was less than the engineer's estimate of \$7,746,068.59. The Metropolitan Council Underutilized Businesses (MCUB) participation goal for this contract is 7%. The Office of Equal Opportunity has determined that Geislinger and Sons, Inc. has met the numeric goals for this contract.

### Rationale

Construction contracts exceeding \$2,500,000 require Council authorization.
