What is a TIP?

- Four-year list of transportation projects funded in whole or part with federal funding
- Must include all projects funded with federal transportation funds and projects that affect air quality
- One of the core federally required planning products for all Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)
- MnDOT incorporates the TIP into its State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)



Key Criteria for TIP and Amendment Approvals

- Consistent with expected funding levels, i.e., fiscally balanced
- Consistent with regional long-range transportation plan
- Conformance with Clean Air Act requirements
- Provide opportunity for public input




Schedule and Input

- TAC recommendation to TAB June 1, 2016
- TAB approved draft for public review June 15, 2016
- Public review/comment period ended August 3, 2016
- TAB considered comments, approval August 17, 2016
- Transportation Committee concurrence
 September 12, 2016
- Metropolitan Council concurrence September 28, 2016
- MnDOT inclusion into STIP September/October, 2016
- Federal approvals November 2016

- Federal Highway \$1.03 Billion
- Federal Transit \$1.15 Billion

- Total \$3.9 Billion
