Definition of Human Trafficking

Human trafficking is the trade of humans, most commonly for the purpose of forced labor, sexual slavery, or commercial sexual exploitation for the trafficker or others

Metro Transit's Involvement Began in 2013


- Attendance at Meetings with State and Local Partners

Susceptability Factors








Human Trafficking Indicators

- ✓ Looks Fearful or Depressed – Not on Their Own
- ✓ Is Being Closely Watched
- ✓ Does Not Have Possession of Their Own Money
- ✓ Shows Signs of Physical Abuse







Transit Police Response to Trafficking Calls

- Notification of Potential Trafficking
- Police Dispatched
- Officer Investigates Report Written
- Video Download
- Information Shared with Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA)
- Ongoing Information Sharing at Police Roll Calls and with Partner Agencies
- Future "Text for Safety" Method of Reporting
