Orange Line BRT Project





Minnesota's most heavily-traveled transportation corridor

- 14,000 existing bus riders each weekday on 26 routes
- Over 26,000 rides by 2040 w/ BRT
- 210,000 vehicles a day
- Past express bus investments


Who are Orange Line riders?

- Access to 30,000 suburban jobs
- Better serves all-day, evening, weekend markets
- Better serves non-downtown trips, especially to the 494 corridor



- Total capital cost: \$150.7M
- Secured \$40M in 2016
- Total committed funding of \$64.52M
- Federal LONP secured in February
 - Allows the Council to fund MnDOT partnership agreement with committed local funding

Six-Month Project Look Ahead

- Execute funding agreements
 - MnDOT Partnership Agreement
 - Local funding agreements with counties
- MnDOT letting June 7, 2017
- Finalize 35W construction schedules with MnDOT
- Continue public outreach
- Complete 60% design of 11 stations and Knox Avenue Transitway
- Obtain remaining \$12.1M in state share funding
- Initiate ROW appraisals and acquisition




MnDOT Coordinated Construction

- Highway and bridge reconstruction
 - New MnPASS lanes
 - Chapter 152 bridge replacements
 - Overpass bridges replaced or improved
 - Noise barrier improvements
 - Local access improvements
 - Exit ramp SB to Lake St
 - Exit ramp NB to 28th St
- Transit station and ramp (part of Orange Line)
 - I-35W & Lake Street station
 - New bus-only downtown access via 12th St

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- Initial construction starts mid-late 2017
- Nearly \$300 million combined project



MnDOT Partnership Construction precedes FTA grant

- FTA Small Starts Grant anticipated in 2018
- MnDOT construction must proceed in 2017
- Orange Line project elements included requires partnership agreement
- Agreement allows MnDOT to build Lake Street Station, 12th Street Ramp, and related construction
- Secured funding approvals and federal permission (LONP) to obligate funding to MnDOT, begin coordinated construction



12th Street Ramp



Existing Conditions at 12th Street

- One of the worst congestion pinch points in the transportation network, greatly affects buses
- 700 buses daily
- 14,000 existing daily I-35W riders

Lake Street Station





During peak hours, over 100 buses per hour will connect Lake Street to the heart of downtown in 7 minutes






Lake Street bus stops, below I-35W bridge



Funding for MnDOT Partnership Agreement

- MnDOT Partnership Agreement funds construction of Orange Line project elements led by MnDOT
- Partnership agreement funds are secured through authorized agreements and commitments
 - Local funds obligated this year, cover all costs through 2020
 - Secured federal CMAQ funds will be brought into the agreement following Small Starts grant award, expected in 2018
- Metro Transit will pay MnDOT in installments starting in Q3 2017




MnDOT Agreement Funds, in Millions
