Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to execute Amendment #3 to the legal services contract (14P026) with Nossaman, LLP related to freight rail for the Southwest Light Rail Transit (Green Line Extension).

Background

Authorization to amend the Nossaman, LLP legal services contract is required because the current contract value of \$500,000 is anticipated to be fully expended by the end of April 2017.

Nossaman, LLP is actively engaged in negotiating three essential freight rail agreements with two freight rail companies: 1) Property acquisition agreement with Canadian Pacific; 2) Construction agreement with Twin Cities and Western Railroad (TCWR); and 3) Operations & Maintenance agreement with TCWR. The agreements must be substantially completed prior to application for the Full Funding Grant Agreement for the Green Line Extension. It is critical to maintain existing relationships at this point in negotiations in order to achieve critical schedule milestones.

The original contract was executed on August 28, 2014 for \$95,000. Amendment #1 was executed on October 13, 2015 to increase the total contract value to \$250,000. Amendment #2 was executed on July 6, 2016 to increase the total contract value to \$500,000. Amendment #3 will add \$300,000 for a total authorized contract value of \$800,000.

Rationale

The contract amendments are for additional time needed to advise the Southwest Project Office on the three critical freight rail agreements. The need for additional hours is due to ongoing negotiations.

Thrive Lens Analysis

Coordination with freight rail companies is necessary to construct and operate the Green Line Extension that will increase the region's prosperity as it will provide access to 80,900 forecasted jobs and a new transportation option for 55,600 forecasted residents within ½ mile of the planned new stations in addition to the 145,300 forecasted jobs and 35,600 forecasted residents in downtown Minneapolis.

Funding

Legal Services is a project budgeted activity and a project eligible expense.

Known Support / Opposition
There is no known opposition to amending the Nossaman, LLP contract.
