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### Background

This project includes work at three different sites throughout the City of Golden Valley. Work on this project will vary by site and includes rehabilitating maintenance holes, lining existing pipe with cured-in-place-pipe, installing new pipe by open cut construction and tunneling methods.

Five responsive, responsible bids were received and opened on February 15, 2018. The bids ranged from \$4,094,731.75 to \$5,570,278.35. Minger Construction Company, Inc. submitted the low bid, which was less than the engineer's estimate of \$4,691,384.

The Metropolitan Council Under-Utilized Business (MCUB) participation goal for this contract is 6%. Minger Construction Company, Inc. has met the numeric goals as determined by the Office of Equal Opportunity.

### Rationale

Construction contracts exceeding \$2,500,000 require Council authorization.

This action advances the Thrive outcome of Stewardship. Public financial resources will be invested efficiently and effectively to maintain and restore existing capacity to existing wastewater infrastructure, which protects the region's natural resources.
