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Background

The ISBU conveyance system collects and conveys wastewater from communities across the Metropolitan Area to MCES wastewater treatment plants. Evoqua will provide nitrate salt solution, and odor control equipment and services to help minimize the odorous impacts of conveying wastewater through the communities we serve and assist in reducing the corrosive impacts of the wastewater on the conveyance system.

Rationale

A purchase order was issued in 2015 to Evoqua Water Technologies Inc. for a period of two years with an option to renew for one additional one-year period. The current procurement will end August 31, 2018. This extension will allow ample opportunity for a competitive bidding process to be conducted in order to implement the procurement and issue a new multi-year contract.
