
Background: March 21, 2018 Council Action

- Authorized Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute:
 - Real Estate Purchase Agreement with Canadian Pacific for Bass Lake Spur Corridor
 - Property Transfer Agreement with HCRRA for Kenilworth Corridor
 - Ancillary documents necessary for closing on Kenilworth and Bass Lake Spur corridors
 - Any settlement or other agreement with TCWR
 - Joint Powers Agreement with HCRRA
- Authorized Petition to Surface Transportation Board (STB) to acquire rights-of-way and physical freight rail assets of Kenilworth and Bass Lake Spur corridors



Actions Since March 2018

- April: Council and HCRRA filed Petition with STB
- April: TCWR filed opposition papers with STB
- April: TCWR filed Lawsuit against Council, HCRRA and CP
- April June: Council, HCRRA and TCWR submitted additional information to STB
- June: Council and TCWR agreed to STB sponsored mediation
- June July: Council, HCRRA and TCWR participated in 4 mediation sessions and reached resolution, subject to Council and County board approvals



Proposed Agreement: Overview

- Tentative agreement consists of three agreements which resolve the disputes between parties
 - Settlement agreement
 - Construction agreement
 - Co-location agreement



Proposed Agreement: Settlement Agreement


- TCWR will release claim and withdraw opposition related to STB Petition and Lawsuit
 - Within 24 hours, TCWR will communicate in writing to the STB and its shippers about the withdrawal of opposition to STB Petition
 - Within 5 days, the Council, HCRRA, TCWR and CP will notify the Court of settlement
- Minimizes financial risk during construction
 - Commits total payment of \$18.5M to TCWR for removal of siding track, technical expertise and activities related to construction
 - Payment to be made over the course of five years, tied to major project milestones
 - Total amount within \$2.003B Project budget
- Avoids long-term financial risk



Proposed Agreement: Settlement Agreement

- Defines timeline for TCWR to vacate siding track
 - TCWR will cease use of siding track to be removed by SWLRT in accordance with schedule in Civil Construction specifications
 - TCWR will cease all storage and freight forwarding activities from remaining siding no sooner than July 1, 2020
- Provides for rehabilitation of freight rail facilities in western portion of the Bass Lake Spur

Proposed Agreement: Construction Agreement

- Governs roles and responsibilities during construction of SWLRT
- Provides for Construction Coordination Committee
 - Council and TCWR
- Allows TCWR to review and comment on contractor submittals
- Defines agreed-to outages when TCWR will temporarily suspend freight rail operations
 - Outages correspond to Civil Construction specifications
- Allows TCWR to inspect construction work on freight rail facilities



Proposed Agreement: Co-Location Agreement

- Provides for Coordination Committee
 - Council, HCRRA, TCWR
- Defines roles and responsibilities
 - In accordance with existing Trackage Rights Agreements (TRAs)
 - Acting on HCRRA's behalf, Council will assume maintenance and liability responsibilities as owner of the Corridors
 - Performance of maintenance obligations will be paid through fees collected from TCWR pursuant to terms of TRAs
 - Consistent with state law passed during 2017 special session,
 Council, through its insurance program, will provide coverage for claims arising from LRT-related incidents
 - TCWR will maintain railroad liability insurance for claims arising from freight rail only incidents



Recommendation

- Authorize the Regional Administrator to execute:
 - (1) a Settlement Agreement with Twin Cities & Western Railroad (TCWR) for the Southwest LRT Project in an amount of \$18.5 million;
 - (2) the associated Co-Location Agreement and Construction Agreement; and
 - (3) any ancillary agreements or documents necessary to implement the Settlement Agreements



Next Steps

- Council, HCRRA and TCWR to complete agreedto actions defined in the Settlement Agreement related to the STB and Lawsuit
- STB decision on the Council & HCRRA Petition
- Council to resubmit application for Letter of No Prejudice to FTA
- FTA to approve LONP request
- Council to award civil construction bid
- Submit FFGA application to FTA
