Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add FTA Section 5339 discretionary funds for Metro Transit's Heywood II Bus Garage (Minneapolis Bus Garage).

Background

Metro Transit requests an amendment because it was awarded Section 5339 discretionary funds from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for the Metro Transit Heywood II Bus Garage (Minneapolis Bus Garage). The garage will provide additional bus storage, operations, support, and maintenance functions to support continued growth in ridership demand and upcoming service expansion. This funding represents part of the cost associated with construction of the new bus garage to achieve optimal capacity and enhanced efficiency for the fleet which is projected to grow by 185 buses by 2032, including electric buses, supporting service expansion. This funding supplements the Heywood Bus Garage project funded in the 2016 Regional Solicitation.

Rationale

The Transportation Advisory Board approves formal amendments to the TIP and the Metropolitan Council concurs with the action of the TAB. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and local funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis.
