- Reduce risks posed by direct connections to MCES Interceptor
- Reduce odors
- Improve system reliability

# **Project Summary**

- Replace 60-inch pipe with 72-inch along Mississippi Lane.
- Cured in Place Pipe (CIPP) lining of 60-inch and 66-inch pipe on River View Lane.
- Replace all manholes.
- Construct local sanitary sewer and larger City lift station to accommodate local wastewater flow. The City will take ownership of the local system at the end of construction.
- Remove direct local connections to interceptor and connect to new local sewer pipe.

# **Trail and Park Impacts**





#### West River Road Trail

- Temporary conveyance pipe set up on the West River Road Trail
- Trail closed between winter 2019-2020 to mid summer 2021 (approximately 18 months)

Jewel Park – (89<sup>th</sup> Ave and West River Road)

- Project Pumping Station and equipment staged at Jewel Park
- Playground, park building, and parking lot remain open to public

#### **Communications Activities & Plan**

- Design Phase: April 2018 September 2019
  - Presentations to neighborhood groups, Three Rivers Park District, and City Council
  - City Council work session to discuss trail closure
  - National Night Out presentation
- Pre-Construction: October 2019 January 2020
  - Mailing to bike and pedestrian advocacy groups, and residents
  - Full Metropolitan Council update on project October 2019
  - Public open house in December
  - Open house and outreach specifically to bike and pedestrian advocacy groups

#### **Communications Activities & Plan**

- Construction: January 2020 to November 2021
  - Ongoing, regular communications to residents and trail users about impacts
  - Signs at Jewell Park and along West River Road Trail
  - Residential parking permits
  - Neighborhood meetings

### **Other Potential Impacts/Mitigation**

- Odor Requirements in contract documents for temporary odor control
- Appearance Construction methods and site restoration
- Access Contractor required to maintain residential access during construction
- Noise & Dust Work with Contractor and City of Brooklyn Park to minimize
- Haul Routes Contractor will coordinate with the City of Brooklyn Park
- Storm Water Run-Off Best management practices, West Mississippi Watershed Management Organization erosion control conditions, MPCA construction storm water permit
