### **Proposed Action**

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### Background

Parks and Trails Legacy Funds were appropriated to the Council for State Fiscal Year (SYF) 2020 and 2021 during the most recent legislative session and SFY20 funds are included in the second quarter budget amendment.

Grant agreements are required for the Council to pass through dollars to Regional Parks Implementing Agencies. Agreements will be executed in two primary groups. The first group will be for projects funded by the SFY20 Legacy appropriation and the second group will be for projects funded by the SFY21 Legacy appropriation. This business item requests authorization to execute SFY20 Legacy funds. Agreements funded with SFY21 Legacy dollars will be executed after funding becomes available on July 1, 2020, amended into the Council's Authorized Capital Budget, and signature authority is approved.

Legacy funds are distributed to Parks Implementing Agencies based upon a formula set in <u>Minn. Stat. §</u> <u>85.53, subd. 3</u>. Data elements to complete the Legacy allocation formula were finalized on July 9, 2019 and Council staff are actively working with Parks Agencies to finalize which projects will be funded with SFY20 Legacy dollars.

A master list of projects to be funded with SFY2020 and 2021 Legacy dollars was developed following State statute and Council policy. Attachment 1 lists projects currently eligible to be fully or partially funded with SFY20 Legacy dollars. These projects have been reviewed and recommended by the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission and approved by the Council on October 24, 2018 through <u>Business Item 2018-261</u>.

This action will allow the Community Development Director to sign agreements for eligible projects once Parks Agencies make a final determination of projects to fund with SFY20 Legacy funds.

### Rationale

The requested action will authorize the Community Development Director to execute grant agreements on behalf of the Metropolitan Council, contingent upon Council approval of the Council's 2019 Quarter 2 Unified Budget Amendment, Business Item 2019-166.

#### **Thrive Lens Analysis**

Regional Parks funding from State appropriations advance Thrive outcomes of Livability by enhancing the quality of life in the region through increasing access to nature and outdoor recreation.

#### Funding

Projects are funded with State Parks and Trails Legacy funds and are included in the 2019 Quarter 2 Unified Budget Amendment, Business Item 2019-166.

#### **Known Support / Opposition**

Regional Parks Implementing Agencies and the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission support these projects. There is no known opposition.
