Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorizes award, negotiation, and execution of sole source contract with Evoqua Water Technologies Inc. for an additional 18 months and not to exceed \$4,500,000 to provide bulk chemicals and services for odor and corrosion control.

Background

Nitrate salts are added to the interceptor system at specific locations to reduce the production of hydrogen sulfide which reduces odors and corrosion in the interceptor system.

The Council has contracted over several years with Evoqua Water Technologies Inc. (Evoqua) to provide nitrate salts, odor control equipment, and services. Evoqua has installed and owns some of the chemical storage tanks and most chemical delivery systems throughout the interceptor system. Staff is currently working on a procurement for a design, build, operate contract for odor and corrosion control services. These documents will not be finished with enough time to transition to the new system before the existing contract expires on January 31, 2021. This continuation of service for an additional 18 months will allow time to competitively procure a vendor for the work.

Rationale

Contracts exceeding \$500,000 require Council approval.

Funding
