# **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council approve an amendment to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to eliminate mobility hubs from St. Paul's electric vehicle carshare project.

# **Background**

This amendment is needed to reduce the project's scope and total cost. This action removes federal funding from the mobility hubs, enabling the sponsor to deliver them early and the project to be completed in a timelier fashion. All federal funding will be used on the vehicle leases and the project will still be completed as originally proposed.

The project is funded by Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) Program funds through the Regional Solicitation.

#### Rationale

The Metropolitan Council approves formal amendments to the TIP. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and local funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis.

#### **Thrive Lens Analysis**

This action promotes livability by expediting provision of an additional transportation option for those without a personal automobile.

## **Funding**

The project is fully funded with local and federal funds.

This proposed action was reviewed and recommended by the Transportation Advisory Board. No known opposition.

This amendment is needed to reduce the project scope and total cost. In order to deliver the project in a more expedited fashion, the project will be phased, and still be completed as originally proposed. All federal funding will be used on the vehicle leases. Other phases will be done with local funds. An Informal Scope Change was approved by Met Council on March 25, 2020.
