
The Metropolitan Airports Commission

- Legislated purpose:
 - Promote efficient, safe and economical air commerce
 - Develop the full potentialities of the metropolitan area as an aviation center
 - Minimize the environmental impact from air transportation and the public's exposure to noise and safety hazards around airports
- Can own and operate airports within a 35-mile radius of downtown
 Minneapolis and St. Paul



 - Fire
 - 9-1-1 dispatch
 - Building inspection
 - Planning and Development
 - Maintenance Department
 - Finance Department
- Funded by rents and fees paid by airport users, not by local income or property taxes




COVID-19 – Industry Impact

- \$245 million decline total estimate




COVID-19 Travel Impact- Enplanements



COVID-19 MAC Board Actions

- Provided relief to key partners:
 - More than \$15 million in waivers and deferrals to airlines, autorental and concessionaires
 - \$41 million in reduced fees to airlines
 - \$4.7 million rent and fee reduction package for concessionaires that also includes longer lease terms and the ability to charge a hospitality fee of up to 4 percent.








Travel Confidently MSP Campaign

GBAC Star Program:

- Developed by American Association of Airport Executives in partnership with the Global Bio-risk Advisory Council
- Recognizes airports maintaining a standard that minimizes risk from coronavirus and other infectious agents

Airport Health Accreditation Program:

- Developed by Airports Council International
- Assesses how MSP health measures align with ICAO Council Aviation Restart Task Force recommendations
- Focuses on best practices in the areas of cleaning and disinfection, physical distancing, staff protection, physical layout, passenger communications and passenger facilities

Industry Path to Recovery


- National traffic forecast for 2020: 36% of 2019 domestic traffic levels
- Beyond vaccine, economy will dictate the full recovery, which could take 4+ years
- Carriers will pursue capacity discipline to offset pandemic losses
- Recovery will be uneven geographically
- MSP well-positioned as Delta hub
- Long-term impacts?




Annual Enplanement Forecast






Budgeted 2021 Operating Revenues

Budgeted 2021 Operating Expenses












Operational Improvements – Baggage Claim








Lake Elmo Runway 14-32 Relocation – Phase 3
