Background

The Council adopted the 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan in May of 2015, which was amended in May of 2018 to incorporate additional wastewater reuse policies. The Council adopted the 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan in partnership with local communities, watershed organizations and other stakeholders. Policies and strategies in the 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan focus on supporting outcomes identified in the Council's current Regional Development Framework, Thrive MSP 2040, the region's overall development framework for the seven-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. The new plan is anticipated to build on the 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan. The process will:

- Identify water issues, concerns, and solutions early on and throughout the process from our communities, partners, stakeholders in the region to better reflect the vision and direction needed for the region
- Optimize regional wastewater investments by aligning work with water quality, water quantity, water conservation, and water supply concerns as appropriate
- Expand the work and direction we began in the 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan as directed by the needs of the region
- Foster approaches and projects that are supported by our partners that allow for growth while promoting sustainable water resources
- Coordinate activities and resource needs

The purpose of the **2050 Water Resources Policy Plan Advisory Group** is to advise and guide Council staff throughout the entire process of developing the new 2050 Water Resources Policy Plan, including the Wastewater System Plan. The Advisory Group will be responsible for advising MCES staff on the process to develop the 2050 Water Resources Policy Plan, including outreach activities needed to gather input from stakeholders and partners as well as on draft ideas and content for the new plan.

Rationale

The Council is required under state law (Minn. Stat. 473.145) to prepare a metropolitan development guide that includes a plan for the region's wastewater collection and treatment system, along with supporting policies, goals, standards and maps. The Council is also required under state law (Minn. Stat. 473.157) to adopt a water resources plan and federal requirements (33 U.S. Code 1288) to adopt requirements for a regional management plan to address pollution from point sources and nonpoint sources. Finally, under state law (Minn. Stat. 473.1565) the Council prepares the Twin Cities metro area Master Water Supply Plan. Together these plans make up the requirements and content for the Water Resources Policy Plan. In addition to providing guidance and direction for the region related to water issues, the Water Resources Policy Plan drives the decisions we make and directs the work we do in MCES.

Thrive Lens Analysis

The 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan supports the Thrive outcomes of Stewardship, Sustainability, Equity, Prosperity, and Livability through wise use of water, protection and restoration of water resources in the region, and efficient operation of the Council's wastewater systems.

Funding

The work group's administrative costs will be small and will be managed within MCES' adopted operating budgets.
