### Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council adopt an amendment to the 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to increase the cost MnDOT's I-494 bridge rehabilitation project.

### Background

MnDOT is increasing the total project cost of its rehabilitation of five I-494 bridges in Eagan and Bloomington. This includes a new project line to show \$17.7 million from the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), leading to a light reduction in National Highway Performance Program (NHPP) and state funds. Total cost increase is \$12,150,000. This is a 2023 project being changed to match the draft 2023-2026 TIP in case of project obligation prior to federal approval of that final TIP.

### Rationale

The Metropolitan Council approves formal amendments to the TIP. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and state funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis.

The project is fully funded with federal and state funds.

**PROJECT BACKGROUND:**

The change reflects a \$12,154,000 cost increase. Because this is a 2023 project, it will be included in the draft 2023-2026 TIP and with these updates. Metro District will align its program to meet MnDOT’s 2023-2026 STIP funding guidance. Therefore, fiscal constraint is maintained.
