Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council approve the following appointments to the Equity Advisory Committee (EAC) Co-Chair Seat:

John Pacheco Jr., Council Member

Background

The Equity Advisory Committee was established by the Metropolitan Council pursuant to MN Statute 473.127. The purpose of the Equity Advisory Committee is to advise the Metropolitan Council in its work to advance equity in the metropolitan region and meet the Council's equity commitments in Thrive MSP 2040. The Equity Advisory Committee is comprised of 21 members, including 4 Council Members, 8 community members from geographic districts (A-H), and 9 community members who serve at-large.

Rationale

The Equity Advisory Committee bylaws stated the Council Chair will recommend to the Council for its approval two Committee Co-Chairs. One of the Co-Chairs will be a Council member serving on the Committee and one Co-Chair will be a geographic member or an at-large member serving on the Committee. The term of each Co-Chair is one year, after which they may be reappointed for an additional one-year term. The Co-Chairs shall preside at all meetings of the Committee and shall have such duties and responsibilities as are normally attendant upon such an office including, but not limited to:

1. Providing leadership and presiding over Committee meetings; and
2. Serving as a Committee liaison to the Council.

Council Member Francisco Gonzalez stepped down from his positions as Council Member and Equity Advisory Committee Co-Chair effective January 31, 2023. Council Member John Pacheco Jr. will assume the position of Council Member Co-Chair until a new Council is seated in March 2023.

Thrive Lens Analysis

The impact of the Equity Advisory Committee is in alignment with the Thrive equity outcome. A

new co-chair to the EAC is necessary to keep the committee functioning. The committee is critical to the Council's work towards advancing all regional outcomes, including equity.
