Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize a public hearing to gather input on the draft Facility Plan for the Forest Lake Interceptor 7029 Rehabilitation, Project Number 808603.

Background

A public hearing is required for a draft facility plan prior to its adoption by the Metropolitan Council as a condition for obtaining project financing through the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority.

Rationale

Condition assessment of this interceptor determined the need for a project based on the overall poor condition of the existing pipe. Three areas of improvements proposed for the project include cleaning the existing interceptor, rehabilitation through trenchless methods, and replacement or rehabilitation of the existing structures.
