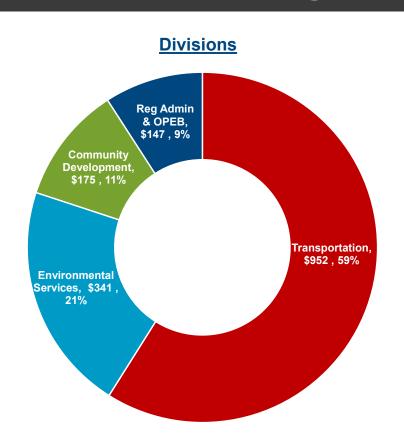

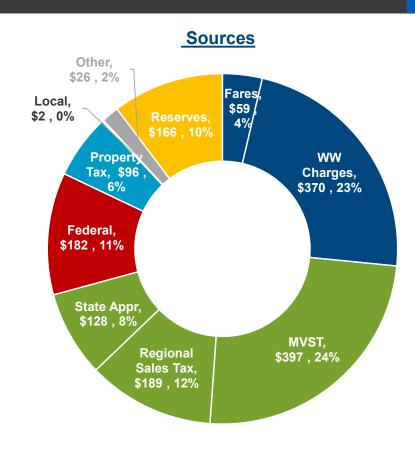

# Changes to 2025 Operating Budget from Preliminary Budget

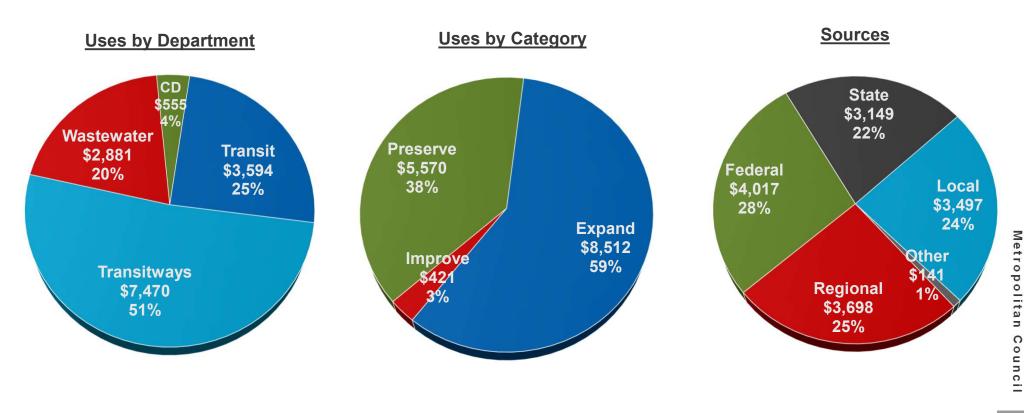
- Dedicate \$1.3m in General Fund levy for continued Business Process Systems Integration (BPSI) work
- Add 22 RA FTEs approved in 2024 Third Quarter Amendment
- Add 1 FTE in General Counsel's Office
- Add \$500k in RA for internal control consulting
- Add \$2.5m in federal pandemic funds for Metro Mobility
- Add 2.25 FTEs in CD for housing and research support
- Add \$750k use of reserves for Local Planning Assistance pass-through grants in CD

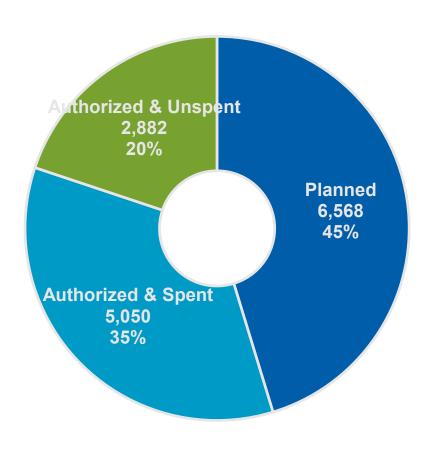

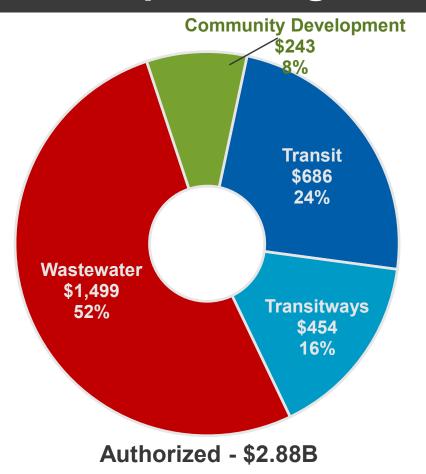


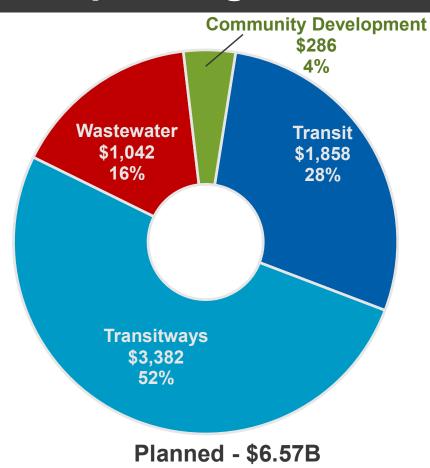
### 2025 Capital Program by Funding Status - \$14.50B



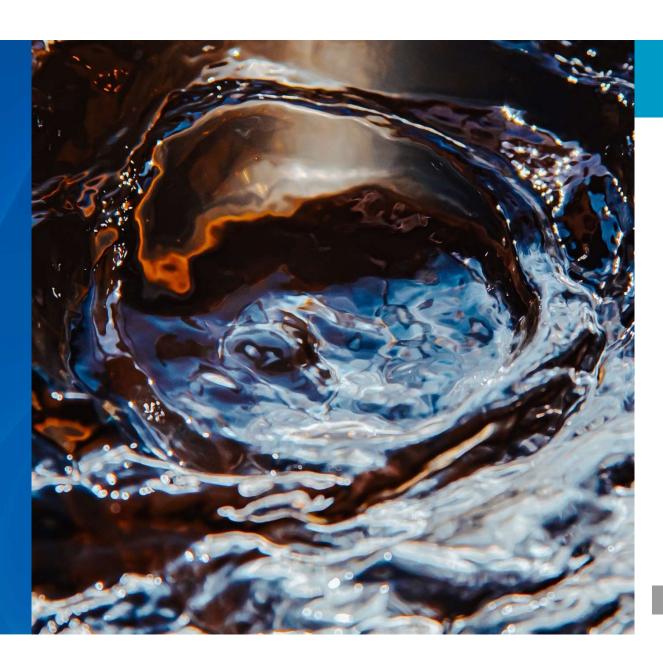


## 2025 Capital Program Future Spending - \$9.45B

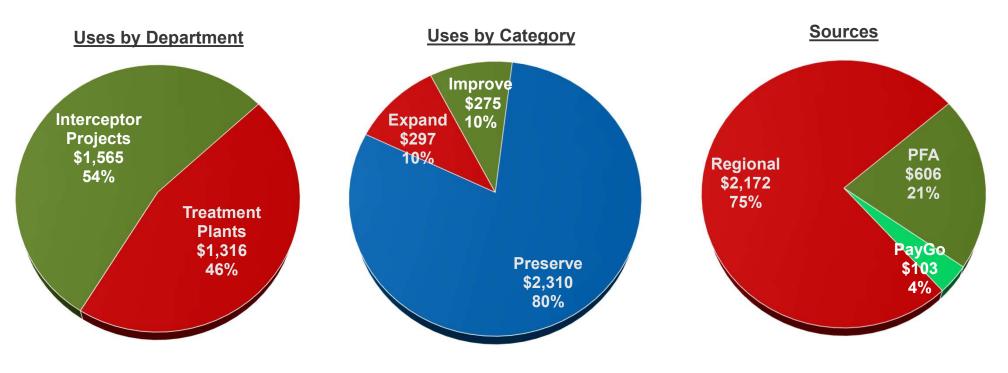




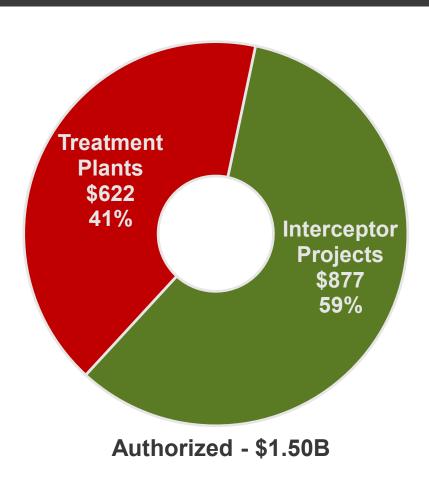

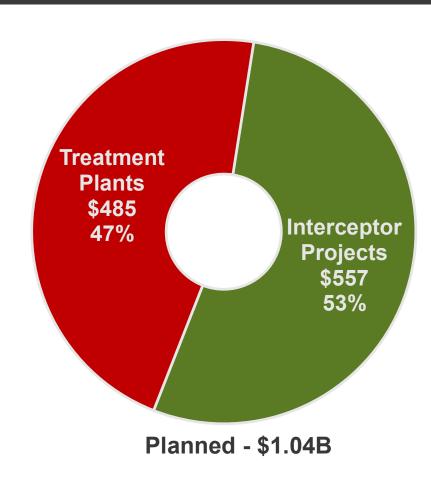


## **ES Capital Program - \$2.88B**

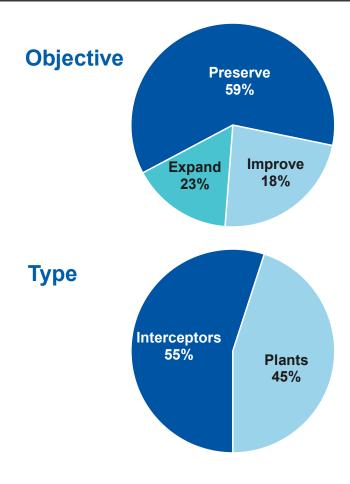

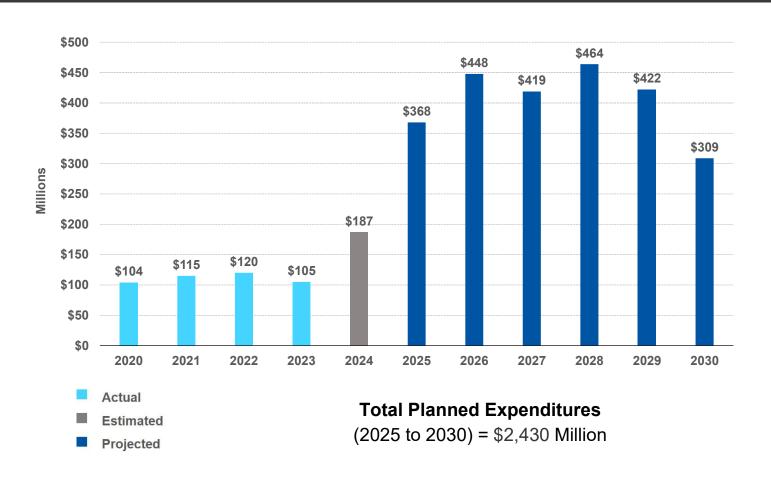

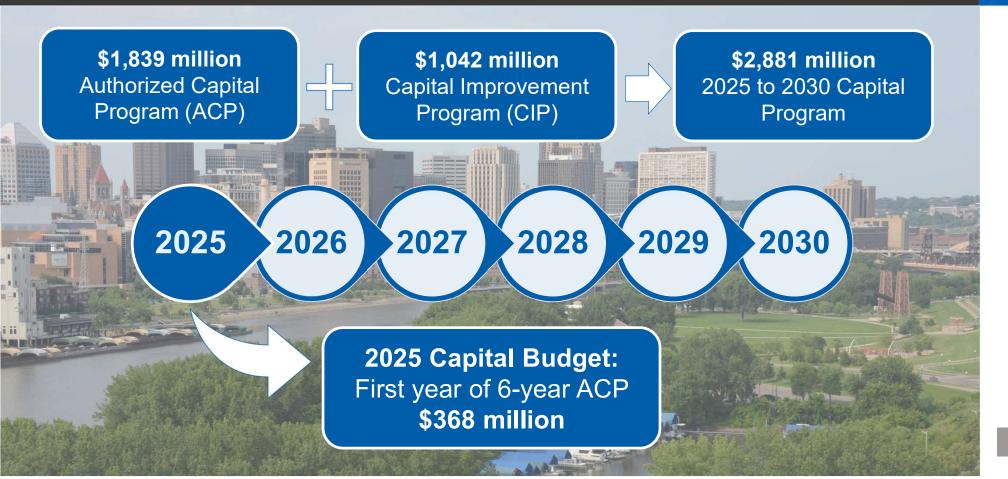

## **Capital Program Financing**

#### Public Facilities Authority (PFA) Loans

**2024:** \$42 million annual loan

1.86% interest rate discount20-year fixed rate

**2025:** \$40 million loan (anticipated)

## **Council General Obligation Bonds**

The Council sells general obligation bonds. The Council has a AAA bond rating and receives low interest rates.

20-year fixed rate

**2024:** \$59.6 million @ 3.52%

**2025: TBD** 

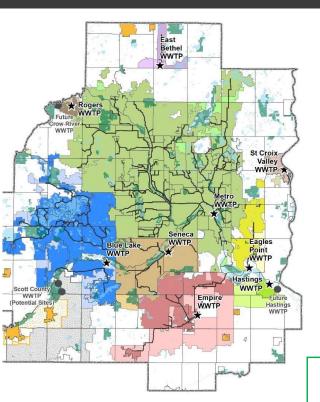
## Pay-As-You-Go (PAYGO)

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## 2025-2030 Capital Program

#### **Planning**

- Capital projects require longer range view – Long Term Focus
- Bus Procurements 12-24 months
- Major construction projects multi-year (garages, Transitways)
- Funding must be secured and Council-authorized
- Funding multiple revenue sources
- Regional asset preservation plans

#### **System Size**

- Over 1,000 regular route and contract buses
- Metro Mobility fleet of 639 small buses
- Over 1,100 customer shelters
- Over 16 support facilities (garages, overhaul base, Police, administration)
- 41 rail platforms
- 65 parking structures/surface lots







## 2025-2030 Capital Program: System Parameters and Size



#### System 2025-2030 CIP Parameters and Size:

- Fiscally Balanced Capital Budget
- Includes Regional Sales Tax
- \$6.38B: \$5.24B CIP and \$1.14B ACP (Authorize Capital Program) including LRT Transitways development (Green and Blue Line Ext.)
- Focus is safety, asset prevention and long-term capital maintenance
- System includes Metro Transit, Metropolitan Transportation Services and Suburban Transit Providers
- Reviewing Travel Behavior changes and workforce demand impacts with bus purchase assumptions, deliveries and operators

- \$285M in grants are programmed in the proposed Capital Improvement Program (2025-2030)

## **Council Owned Housing Capital Program**

#### **History**

- Family Affordable Housing Program established in 1999
- 150 units purchased between 2001 and 2004
- 4 additional units purchased in 2022 through partnership with City of Edina

#### Authorized - \$2.4M

- Funded by rental property Income
- \$2M transfer from operating reserves to ACP for purchase of five replacement properties

#### Planned - \$1.8M

- \$300K per year from 2025-2030
- Funded by rental property income
