Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to enter into an agreement with CenterPoint Energy to relocate a natural gas line for the purposes of constructing Project 809207 1-MN-346 Rehabilitation Phase 2 for an amount not to exceed \$600,000.

Background

Interceptor 1-MN-346 conveys wastewater from Edina, Richfield, and Minneapolis. A segment of interceptor in Minneapolis north of Bossen Field has sagged and restricted water flow. The sagged segment needs to be removed and replaced to restore capacity and accommodate future flows. A CenterPoint Energy natural gas pipeline needs to be relocated to allow interceptor removal and replacement. Relocation of the gas main is more technically feasible and cost-effective than rerouting the interceptor to avoid the gas main. CenterPoint Energy completes all relocations inhouse.

Rationale

Council policy requires contracts for the procurement of goods and services in excess of \$500,000 be approved by the Council.
