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## Background

The Engineering and Facilities 2025 – 2030 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) includes approximately \$288 million for capital improvements, including new construction as well as rehabilitation of aging facilities and systems. An essential element to complete this work is the availability of skilled engineering firms to perform this work.

A Request for Proposal was issued on July 30, 2024. A pre-proposal meeting was hosted by Council staff that outlined the solicitation requirements, discussed project specifications, and responded to plan holder inquiries. There were twenty plan holders, seventeen consultants, one subcontractor, two plan rooms, and six of the plan holders identified as minority, woman, small, veteran, or disadvantaged business enterprises. On September 11, 2024, the Council received two proposals to be evaluated for the consideration of award.

In accordance with the Brooks Act, the evaluation of proposals followed a two-step process. The evaluation panel ranked and selected the most technically qualified proposers. Following approval of the evaluation panel findings, conclusions, and recommendation, the costing data of the highest ranked proposers were reviewed by a negotiation panel that negotiated pricing and agreed that the final prices have been determined to be fair and reasonable.

The panel recommends the proposals submitted by Kimley-Horn & Associates, Inc. and Collins Engineers, Inc. as the most advantageous to the Council. Work orders for specific projects under these master contracts will be awarded on an as-needed basis.

## Rationale

The execution of an engineering contract that exceeds \$500,000 requires Council approval.

#### Thrive Lens Analysis

This action promotes Stewardship through needed rehabilitation and replacement of existing Metro Transit assets.

## Funding

Funding will be included in future Council authorized capital and operating budgets. Work orders will only be executed after Council budget authority has been approved.

#### Small Business Inclusion

The Office of Equity and Equal Opportunity (OEEO) assigned a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal of 4% for this solicitation. OEEO determined that the firms being recommended for award have met the DBE requirements of this contract.
