Commitment to Acknowledge



One of the recommended commitments from the American Indian Advisory Council addressed public acknowledgement:

- As a responsible government agency, the Council will lead in publicly recognizing the genocide and displacement that American Indian communities survived and continue to endure.
 - The Advisory Council is drafting a Land, Water, a) and People Acknowledgement Statement for the Met Council and to include in Imagine 2050.
 - The Advisory Council encourages the Met **b**) Council to understand the value of a statement is to increase recognition of the seven-county region as Dakota land and promote action.

American Indian Advisory Council Process

- AIAC met throughout 2024 to learn about the Met Council and develop recommendations for action
 - Advised to commit to take action first, acknowledgement comes second
- After presenting the recommended commitments to Met Council on September 4, 2024, the AIAC drafted a Land, Water, and **People Acknowledgement Statements**
 - The Acknowledgements Statement was presented to Met Council October 16, 2024

Procedures for using the Short Statement

- 1. THAT the Metropolitan Council will use the short Land, Water, and People Acknowledgement as follows:
 - a. Read by the Chair of the Met Council, or their designee, at the beginning of every meeting of the Council's governing body and its Committee of the Whole.
 - b. Read by the Chairs of the Met Council's Standing Committees at the beginning of committee meetings at their discretion;
 - c. Read by the Chairs of other Met Council committees and Council Members and staff leading other public meetings at the beginning of meetings at their discretion;
 - d. Included in written form on webpages that post agendas for Met Council and Standing Committee meetings;
 - e. Included in official plans of Met Council;
 - f. Included in new employee and Council Member onboarding and orientation and all employee internal continuing education; and
 - g. Adapted for use at Met Council buildings and facilities.

Procedures for Using the Long Statement

- 2. THAT the Metropolitan Council will use the long Land, Water, and People Acknowledgment as follows:
 - a. On a Met Council webpage about American Indian communities and Tribal relations;
 - b. Where recognition or moments of reflection are appropriate and needed; and
 - c. As part of educational resources for employees, residents, and local governments.
