Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council adopt an amendment to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add a multi-use trail and intersection improvements to the City of Bloomington's CSAH 34 (Normandale Blvd) sidewalk, curb ramp, and signal project.

Background

The City of Bloomington was awarded \$2,000,000 in the 2024 Regional Solicitation for its CSAH 34 (Normandale Blvd) sidewalk project. The project includes ADA curb ramps, traffic signals, and retaining walls. The project was amended into the 2025-2028 TIP on December 11, 2024. This request involves the addition of locally funded, locally sponsored trail and intersection improvements adjacent to the project.

Rationale

The Metropolitan Council approves formal amendments to the TIP. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and state funds are sufficient to fully fund the project.

Thrive Lens Analysis

On Feb. 12, 2025, the Council adopted Imagine 2050, which builds on policy direction in Thrive MSP 2040. Under the Thrive lens this action promotes *stewardship* by enabling the City of Bloomington to bundle two efforts, thereby improving efficiency.

Funding

This project is fully funded with federal and local funds.

Small Business Inclusion

The project included in this request is federally funded. The Minnesota Department of Transportation will oversee the federal requirements, including the DBE requirement.




