### **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council adopt the Facility Plan for the Burnsville Interceptor Improvements Project, MCES Project No. 809058, per the attached Resolution No. 2012-50.

### **Background**

The facility plan addresses interceptor and maintenance hole rehabilitation in Burnsville. Rehabilitation will improve the integrity of MCES' facilities and improve system reliability. The Burnsville Interceptor concrete pipe gravity system was constructed in the 1970s. Recent inspection revealed corrosion damage to the concrete surfaces of the pipe and maintenance structures. The system totals over 25,000 lineal feet in length and ranges from 36" to 72" in diameter. The recommended alternative is to rehabilitate 27 maintenance holes and use trenchless methods to line all or parts of interceptors 7030, 7033, and 8560. A public hearing was held on November 15, 2012. The public comment period ended on November 26, 2012. No comments were received at the public hearing or during the public comment period.

### **Rationale**

Public Facilities Authority (PFA) loan funding eligibility requires formal adoption of the Facility Plan by resolution (attached), following a public hearing on the draft Facility Plan.

### **Funding**

Construction funding has been included in the 2013 Capital Program. MCES will submit this project to PFA for inclusion in its 2014 Intended Use Plan.

### **Known Support / Opposition**

MCES staff is not aware of opposition to the project.
