Background

Since 1995, the Metropolitan Council has annually prepared a Regional Parks System use estimate. The use estimate is used in funding formulas to determine each regional park implementing agency's share of Operations and Maintenance, Capital Improvement Program, and Parks and Trails Legacy Fund dollars.

The use estimates are based upon a four-year average of visit data. Council staff works with regional park implementing agencies to conduct visitor counts in regional parks and trails from Memorial Day to Labor Day. The count data are then used, along with the preceding three years of data, to develop an estimate for Regional Parks System use for the entire calendar year.

Highlights from the 2016 Annual Park Use Estimate report will be provided.
