### Parks and Trails Legacy Fund

- Legacy Amendment in 2008
- biennium is \$44 million
- **Opportunity Fund program**

The Parks and Trails Legacy Fund was created to support parks and trails of statewide or regional significance after the passage of the Clean Water, Land and

The Council receives an appropriation each biennium for the Regional Parks System; these funds are allocated to the Regional Park Implementing Agencies based on a formula driven by O&M shares, population, and non-local park use The estimated funding for the Regional Parks System for the FY2022/2023

10% of the Council's PTLF appropriation is set aside for the Park Acquisition
