


Higher Growth

How much? Where?


- Business-as-Usual: recent growth and development patterns continue
- High growth/compact development
- High growth/dispersed development
- Low growth/compact development
- Low growth/dispersed development

Main Takeaways




- Region-wide we expect growth through 2050.

What could a scenario framework do for **Regional Parks System policy?**


- It helps us think about and develop policies to achieve our regional vision, mission, and values.
- It helps us explore how we can advance priorities in the Regional Parks System under different futures. (e.g. natural resource protection, equity, geographic balance)
- It helps us explore equity implications by asking how a specific type of change would impact different communities.
- It informs our understanding of policy trade-offs and synergies. (e.g. adequate funding, system additions, acquisitions)
