Phases

- **1. Regional Arts Exhibition**
 - Four artists create illustrations for regional display (bus & train wraps, park signs, public site posters, etc.)

2. Artist-Led Engagement

- Nine artists do pop-up engagement, any artistic medium
- 3. Council Engagement Tools
 - Games, interactives, Social Pinpoint
- 4. Community Conversations
 - Multi-part series focused on RDG goals and themes
