Foundation for 2025 Work Planning

- **2050 Regional Parks and Trails Policy Plan Section Nine**
 - Four-year work plan for Policy Plan Implementation
 - 17 items organized into five themes (Accountability and Research, Protection and Restoration, Culture, Trails, Finance)
- **On-going Council Parks Work**
 - Day-to-day work for the planning, parks ambassador, and finance staff, including but not limited to:
 - Long-range plan reviews
 - Coordinating equity and outreach work across the region
 - Administering grant programs
- **Agency-identified Regional Topics**
 - **Trail System Coordination**
 - Strategic Funding
 - Discussion and Exploration of regional policies and efforts (e.g. Subclassifications, cost-effective research methods, greater advocacy at State level)
