

#### What is the METRO D Line?





- Significant upgrades and substantial replacement of the Route 5
- METRO D Line is projected to be 20 to 25 percent faster than Route 5 with 40 stations spaced 1/2 mile apart.
- 18 miles from Brooklyn Center
   Transit Center to Mall of
   America Transit Center.
- The METRO D Line will be the primary service in the corridor, running every 10 minutes during peak time, with increased service on nights and weekends.
- 40 new platforms, 77 stations with increased amenities

Construction on coordinated projects by others begins 2020



**D:** Shelter **E:** Ticket Machine/Fare Validation **F:** Emergency Phone


G: Trash/Recycling H: Textured Warning Strip I: Platform Area








#### **Typical Platform Layout- Overhead View**



- Since 2017, D Line staff have attended or hosted 85 communityfocused events on or near the D Line corridor
- Other project activities to gather feedback include surveying, doorknocking, flyering, bus ride-alongs, stop pop-ups, advertising, as well as online participation options
- Major project materials translated into Spanish, Somali, Hmong
- In 2019-2020: continued designfocused communication with "station neighbors", prepare communities for construction
