Safety & Security Action Plan Overview

In June 2022, the Metropolitan Council endorsed the Safety & Security Action Plan three areas of work

- 1. Improving conditions on the system
- 2. Training and supporting employees
- 3. Engaging customers and partners



Safety & Security Action Plan work underway

Examples include:

- Officer and CSO hiring
- Supplemental security pilot
- Two-car light rail train pilot
- Resumed Red Kite training
- Increased opportunities for police operator relationship building



Safety & Security Action Plan builds on past investments

Examples include:

- Increased resources for presence on the system
- Improved cameras on the light rail
- Creation of the Real Time Information Center
- Increased staff for Text for Safety Program (612-900-0411)
- Increased staff for cleaning on-board rail and at public facilities
- Investment in MTPD's Homeless Action Team





Tracking and reporting performance

- Metropolitan Council established a quarterly reporting requirement on Safety & Security Action Plan progress
 - Reports will include updates on action items' implementation and data on measurable goals
 - First quarterly report will be available this quarter and presented to the Metropolitan Council on October 5
