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What is the Transportation Policy Plan?

An Investment Plan

- Directs investments and identifies major projects for the regional transportation system, like highways and transitways
- Directs investment of all federal transportation dollars, even those spent on local projects


A Guide for Local Planning

- Provides local governments with a regional vision and goals to build local transportation, land use, and other plans
- The plan sets policies and provides guidance for how the regional transportation system should or will be implemented

Terms & Definitions

- Goals are broad directional statements that more specifically describe the desired end states for the region.
- Objectives are the <u>achievable results</u> that advance each regional goal.
- Policies are the statement of <u>intent and approach</u> to regional issues or topics, independently and with partners.
- Actions are the <u>specific strategies or activities</u> to implement polices and achieve goals.

Goals & Objectives Engagement

Goals are under development, informed by two phases of engagement.

- Phase 1 included hearing needs and feedback from:
 - Local, regional, and state government through listening sessions
 - Small interviews and two broad listening sessions with advocacy, equity, climate, and neighborhood focused groups
- Using the early findings, Phase 2 included two broad online workshops and a survey to prioritize the themes heard.

Selection of Goals & Objectives Themes

Summary of findings is still underway. Draft goals are expected later this summer.

- Early findings show safety and security is the top priority for most stakeholders.
 - These include both **injury prevention** and ensuring **personal security** when using all forms of transportation.
- Public health, climate mitigation, equity, and resilience were also priorities, though there were a wider variety of ideas on these topics.
- Goal statements on multimodal opportunity, modernization, timeliness and reliability, natural systems, the economy, and growth had a wide range of responses.

Policies & Actions Development


Phased Approach

- Phase 1: Identified Existing Policies & Actions
- Phase 2: Refinement & Gap Identification
- Phase 3: Development & Reduction

Phase 3


- Small teams with technical expertise draft and recommend policies and implementing actions
- Present to our Technical Working Group for Refinement
- Workshops to refine, with drafts expected this fall

 - Opportunity for further engagement with the TAAC on implementing actions
- Plan chapters are written and revised through early next year
- Draft plan available for public comment next spring
