RE: Schedule and Public Involvement Process for the Transportation Improvement

Program Amendment to include the projects selected in the 2011 regional solicitation.

On June 20, 2012, the Transportation Advisory Board completed the 2011 regional solicitation selection process by voting to select 58 projects to receive \$170 million in federal transportation funding. The TAB selected projects to receive funds through four federal programs defined in SAFETEA-LU: the Surface Transportation Program – Urban Guarantee, Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program, the Transportation Enhancements Program and the Bridge Improvement and Replacement Program.

Typically, the selection of projects would be completed in January in time to be added to the draft Transportation Improvement Program that goes through a public hearing process. The TAB suspended the 2011 regional solicitation process twice which delayed the selection of projects until June 2012 when the draft 2013-2016 TIP was already released for public comment.

Shortly after the TAB selected projects in June, Congress passed a new federal transportation funding act, MAP-21, and it was signed into law by President Obama in July. Before the selected projects could be amended into the 2013-2016 TIP, MnDOT and the TAB needed to more fully understand the funding levels that could be assumed for 2015 and 2016.

Regarding funding levels, in general terms, MAP-21 provides more funding to the federal programs allocated and managed by state departments of transportation and less funding to programs typically allocated and managed by Metropolitan Planning Organizations. MnDOT developed a funding transition plan for all federal projects programmed in the 2013-2016 State Transportation Improvement Program. MnDOT will guarantee the federal share for all projects programmed in the 2013-2016 STIP in the years they are currently programmed. Projects that move from their current program year to a future or later program year will not be guaranteed funding. For the program years 2015 and 2016, MnDOT will fund up to the set aside amounts for STP, Bridge, CMAQ and Enhancements identified in the 2013-2016 TIP and STIP. Approximately \$13 million in STP funds must be programmed in 2017 through the 2014-2017 TIP development process this spring and summer.

Because only set aside amounts were identified in the 2013-2016 TIP, there has not been an opportunity for public review of the 2011 solicitation projects. On the back of this page is a suggested schedule and public involvement process that would follow a similar public involvement process as the TIP, but modified to be appropriate for this regionally significant amendment. The schedule was developed in consultation with Federal Highway Administration.
