BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF ACTION:

The TAB Executive Committee requested staff and the PMT to provide modal funding options to help inform applicants of the approximate dollar values available by mode prior to the release of the next solicitation. Approximately \$150 million of total federal funds are available in 2018 and 2019.

Based on discussions of these modal funding options, the Regional Solicitation Steering Committee recommends using ranges shown in Table 1. A range of points will provide TAB with some flexibility in selecting projects based on the quality and number and cost of projects that are submitted. For Transit and TDM Projects, as well as Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities, the Steering Committee recommends a 10-percentage point range. A 20-percentage point range is proposed for Roadways Including Multimodal Elements because of the high percentage of funds going to this mode and the fact that these projects are often awarded the maximum of \$7 million (i.e., there is a five percentage point swing by adding or subtracting a \$7 million project).
