## What is an Strategic Highway Safety Plan?


- Major component and requirement of the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) (23 U.S.C. § 148).
- It is a statewide-coordinated safety plan that provides a comprehensive framework for reducing highway fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads
- Identifies State's key safety needs and guides investment decisions toward strategies and countermeasures with the most potential to save lives and prevent serious injuries



## This SHSP will be different than previous SHSPs

- Focus will be on identifying actions to support high priority focus areas
  - Implementation will be reported to TZD leadership team at future meetings
  - Be thinking about things we should be doing, not things that we have already done

- Goal establishment will be a different process
  - Annual performance measures in place for short term attainable goals
  - SHSP fatality targets should be more ambitious
  - Stakeholder activity
