#### May 2022 – May 2024 Work

- Transportation System Performance Evaluation
- 10+ contributing studies and plans, for example:
  - Transportation Attitudes and Needs Assessment
  - Twin Cities Highway Mobility Needs Analysis
- <u>50+ listening sessions or interviews with government and community</u> stakeholders
- Draft policies, actions
  - 8 policy development teams with external partners
  - 3 policy development workshops with external stakeholders
  - 25+ meetings
- Developed funding assumptions, incorporating 2023 legislative changes
- Draft documents circulated for review, nearly 3,000 comments total
- Work Group discussions
  - 23 Technical Advisory Working Group meetings
  - 15 Advisory Work Group meetings



#### Based on internal and external feedback

#### **Dynamic and Resilient Objectives**

- People and businesses trust that transportation infrastructure and services will withstand and recover quickly from natural and human-caused disruptions.
- People <u>have better travel options beyond driving alone to can better</u> meet their daily needs, with <u>a focus on improving travel times timely</u>, reliab<u>ilityle</u>, direct<u>ness</u>, and affordabilityle options beyond driving alone.
- People <u>have more predictable travel times when traveling on highways, with a focus on</u>
  <u>reducing experience more predictable travel times without experiencing excessive delays</u>
  when traveling on highways.
- People and businesses can rely on predictable and cost-effective movement of freight and goods.

#### **Climate Change Objectives**

- The region's transportation system minimizes its contributions to climate change greenhouse gas emissions.
- People have more <u>reliable</u> access to <del>and trust in</del> zero emissions vehicle infrastructure.
- By 2050, the region reduces vehicle miles traveled by 20% per capita below 2019 levels.

#### **Natural Systems Objectives**

The region's transportation system and the people who use it limit their impacts on protects, restores, and enhances natural systems (e.g., air, water, vegetation, and habitat quality)

- Regional Solicitation (RS) changed to Investment Priority (IP)
- Comprehensive Planning (CP) changed to Local Planning (LP)
- Added Technical Capacity Building (CB), Partner (P)
- Retained Work Program (WP)

#### Continued to refine actions

- Language edits, some combining and moving around
- Added action: "Explore options to connect RBTN corridors and alignments to rural communities."





