Requested Action

The Metropolitan Council requests an amendment to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add charging and fueling infrastructure.

Recommended Motion

That the Transportation Advisory Board recommend approval of an amendment to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program to add charging and fueling infrastructure.

Background and Purpose

The Metropolitan Council was awarded \$15,000,000 through the Federal Highway Administration's Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) grant program, round 2. In order to receive the funding, the project must be added to the Transportation Improvement Program. The Council plans to use the funds to create a pass-through competitive funding program for Level 2 electric vehicle (EV) chargers to deploy 937 dual-port Level 2 chargers (a total of 1,875 ports) across the region.

This project is not related to any funding provided through the Regional Solicitation.

Relationship to Regional Policy

Federal law requires that all TIP amendments meet the following tests: fiscal constraint; consistency with the adopted regional transportation plan; and opportunity for public input. It is the TAB's responsibility to recommend TIP amendments to the Council for adoption, provided these requirements are met.

Staff Analysis

The TIP amendment meets fiscal constraint because the federal and local funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. This amendment is consistent with the Metropolitan Council Transportation Policy Plan, adopted by the Metropolitan Council on February 12, 2025. Public input opportunity for this amendment is provided through the TAB's and the Council's regular meetings.

Committee Comments and Action

At its April 2, 2025, meeting, the Technical Advisory Committee recommended approval of an amendment to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add charging and fueling infrastructure.
