We have one project in the TIP:

2013 – PED/BIKE, Construct Hardwood Creek Trail

The termini included in the TIP does not correctly identify the project. It should read: Construct Hardwood Creek Regional Tr Extension from 145th St to 140th St in Hugo

145th Street is old County Highway 8. We realigned CSAH 8 in 2007. The TE application that we submitted made references to County Highway 8 on the application title page, but the termini included in the Project Information page and supporting maps show the termini to be 145th Street. Attached is the supporting information from the application.

We are requesting that the description of the northern termini be revised in the Final TIP to reference 145th Street as was provided in the original TE application from the 2009 solicitation. This is only a change in street name, not a termini change, and should not require a scope change.





The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) has worked closely with the staff of the Metropolitan Council and the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) and the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) in development of the draft 2013-2016 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Information was supplied in April and May, 2012 for development of the project tables. Several minor changes have occurred since that time, including end-of-year changes affecting a number of individual projects. These changes are documented in the attached tables.

A significant change to emphasize is the latest staging of the development and construction of the new St. Croix crossing near Stillwater and Oak Park Heights. The Minnesota approach to the new crossing has been changed to a Design Build project with the letting advanced from FY 2015 to FY 2013 and completion scheduled for the fall of 2014. The river crossing itself remains in FY 2014 with a scheduled completion for the fall of 2016.

Another important point regarding the draft TIP relates to is the funding assumptions. The final 2013-2016 TIP funding level set asides representing those funds allocated by the Metropolitan Council/TAB are based on the funding levels established under SAFETEA-LU which had been under continuing resolution since September 2009. The recent passage of the new reauthorization of the Federal Transportation bill, MAP-21 appears to bring changes in both program categories and funding levels through the end of Federal FY 2014. The scope of these changes is still undetermined but based on new categories and associated funding, will certainly impact the entire 2013-2016 TIP timeframe. MnDOT will work diligently with Federal Highway Administration staff as well as Metropolitan Council/TAB staff and committees to clarify program categories and funding levels as quickly as possible, but many of these issues will require considerable analysis and policy level discussions and therefore will take some time. We would expect that these issues should be clarified prior to the proposed amendment of regionally selected projects for FY 2015 and 2016 to the 2013-2016 TIP and STIP. It is important that all participants reviewing the draft TIP recognize that many changes will come as a result of MAP-21 and that approval of the TIP document under consideration results in a TIP/program of projects that will change.

With the proposed changes, we believe that the TIP remains fiscally balanced in the first two years, and generally balanced in the remaining years. These proposed changes do not affect the air quality conformity analysis of the TIP, as we have discussed with staff of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and the Metropolitan Council.

Metropolitan Area: Report on public comments and staff recommendations.

The Transportation Advisory Board held a 45-day public comment period on the draft 2013-2016 Transportation Improvement Program, beginning on May 16 and ending on July 6, 2012. All comments received at the public hearing held on June 20, 2012 are included in the public hearing report and all written comments received by the close of the public comment period are attached to this memo. Below is a summary of the three comments received during the public comment period with staff response and recommendations.

COMMENTS RECEIVED DURING THE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

<u>Ted Schoenecker, Transportation Planning Manager, Washington County</u>
Staff received an email and attachment dated May 19, 2012 with the following comment:

The termini of SP# 082-090-004, Hardwood Creek Regional Trail Extension, is incorrect. The project description in the 2013-2016 TIP should read as follows: Construct Hardwood Creek Regional Trail Extension from 145th Street to 140th Street in Hugo. 145th Street is old County Highway 8, which was realigned in 2007. The Transportation Enhancements application references the old alignment which is in the public comment draft TIP.

Staff response and recommendation: This is an important clarification because accurate project termini must b included in the TIP. Mr. Schoenecker also contacted MnDOT staff and the project termini are now accurately described in the final draft Program going forward for adoption.

<u>Chuck Ballentine, Interchange Project Office Senior Administrative Manager</u> Staff received a signed letter dated June 15, 2012 with the following comment:

Section 5309 funding for the Interchange Project was included in the 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program by amendment. The Interchange Project Office asked that the funding amended into the previous TIP is appropriately included in the 2013-2016 TIP because final action on the contract and ground breaking is scheduled very soon.

Staff response and recommendation: In March 2012, the TAB adopted an amendment to the 2012-2015 TIP to include \$10 million in TIGER funds in FY 2012. Staff contacted the project manager who said the funds have been authorized and transferred to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). The FTA has approved the grant application from the Interchange Office and has begun spending the TIGER funds. Because the funds were authorized in FY 2012, the TIP amendment would not appear in the 2013-2016 TIP.

Scott McBride, Metro District Engineer, Minnesota Dept. of Transportation.

Staff received a letter dated July 5, 2012 requesting that a number of changes be made to state and local projects listed in the Public Hearing copy of the draft 2013-2016 TIP. These reflect end-of-the-year changes affecting a number of individual projects. The letter noted the recent passage of MAP 21 and the need for MnDOT and the MPOs to understand the changes in program categories and funding levels. Attached to the letter were several tables listing projects to be deferred, projects to be deleted, projects to be advanced and a table of new projects to be added.

Staff response and recommendation: The changes described in the tables sent with Mr. McBride's letter reflect MnDOT's normal end of fiscal year balancing changes, updated project cost estimates, new project funding commitments and projects shifting among program years within the TIP timeframe. Staff recommends that the changes provided in the attached tables be incorporated into the 2013-2016 TIP.
