Finance Chapter Proposed Updates

- Proposed changes related to Transit revenues and spending Incorporates Riverview LRT financials into Current Revenue Scenario Include D Line state bonding at \$30M

- Updated MVST forecast
- Total Revenues and Spending increase to \$93.5B, Transit at \$36.5B Highway User revenue share to Metro area continues to show decline (pg 4.5)

Congestion Management Process

The Congestion Management Process (CMP) is:

- Systematic
- Data-driven
- Regionally accepted
- Federally required





CMP Goals

- by:
 - Managing congestion
 - Ensuring the reliable movement of people and goods

Improve the performance of the transportation system



Three Phases

The CMP as developed in 2018-2019 proceeds in three phases:

- Identification of corridor study areas for additional analysis
- Strategy screening
- Project/program identification and implementation



CMP – Expected Changes

- Correct tenses from future to past to reflect current status (not redlined)
- Reference to adopted targets added to Chapter 13 **Performance Outcomes**



CMP – Ongoing Work Items

- Corridor analysis by Metropolitan Council, MnDOT and other regional transportation stakeholders
- Transportation Trends Report annual update



Chapter 13: Performance Outcomes



Chapter Overview

- Two objectives:
 - Are we achieving our goals?
 - Tool to guide actions of the region to achieve our TPP vision
- Outlines anticipated 2040 conditions under three revenue scenarios
 - Current revenue scenario, increased revenue scenario, "no build" scenario
- Performance measure outcomes organized by TPP goals
 - System stewardship; safety/security; access to destinations; competitive economy; healthy/equitable communities; leveraging trans investments to guide land use



Key Changes

- Updates of the federally required performance measures to the latest adopted targets
- Inclusion of (placeholder) transit safety performance measures (no targets adopted)
- Update of trends/existing performance
- New modeled results for the current revenue scenario
- Increased revenue scenario still under development
- Outcomes and analysis will be updated once increased revenue scenario is complete
