Hwy 10 Access Planning Study

Highway 10 between Elk River/Ramsey City Limits and Rum River in Anoka (7.3 miles)

- Transition between rural expressway and freeway
 - 33,500 to 61,000 ADT
 - 5 signalized intersections
- Previous local vision (2002-09)
 - \$300M conversion to freeway







Study Need and Purpose

Highway 10 between Elk River/Ramsey City Limits and Rum River in Anoka (7.3 miles)

- More than 1600 crashes in 10 years
 - Crash rate greater than twice the average
 - 13 fatalities including 4 pedestrians
- Multiple hours of congestion daily
 - Peak hour trip times increase more than 70% over off-peak
 - Westbound signal back-up of more than 1 mile in afternoon









Our Approach

Highway 10 between Elk River/Ramsey City Limits and Rum River in Anoka (7.3 miles)

- Consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP)
- A greater focus on specific problem areas
- Consider less-traditional strategies not available 10 years ago
- Recognized reality of funding limitations
- Better utilize existing infrastructure
- Right-sized, fundable-scale projects
- Commitment to deliver




Initial Findings

Initial Findings

- Pedestrian exposure is high
- Nearly ½ of crashes occur in eastern ¼ of study area
- 1 in 5 peak periods experience a crash
- Traffic volumes limit at-grade options







Initial Recommendations


Types of Improvements Considered

- Close, consolidate, and modify access
- Local roadway and trail connections
- Reduced conflict intersections
- Grade separation at primary intersections




