
Guidelines for Transit Information at Bus Stops – system-wide standards

Tier 1: Low Boarding, Stand-alone Stops









Purpose & Goals:


- Create quality waiting facilities at bus stops to enhance access to employment, education and services.
 - ☐ New passenger waiting shelters
 - ☐ Improved transit information
 - ☐ Lighting for shelters
 - ☐ In some cases, radiant heat in shelters
 - ☐ Pedestrian & accessibility connections
- Focus improvements to serve people living in areas of racially concentrated poverty
- Engage communities on questions of regional transit equity




Racially Concentrated Areas of Poverty



Neighborhoods of Focus

- □ 150 Shelters at NEW Locations
- Enhancement of 75 Existing Shelters
- ☐ Shelters to include:
 - Improved transit information
 - Light wherever possible
 - Heat in some cases
- ☐ Pedestrian access improvements in some locations



Throughout Minneapolis

- ☐ 75-100 Replacement Shelters
 - Shelters acquired from CBS Outdoors


