
Piloting a modified safety net Supplemental Service to replace the former Peak Demand Overflow (PDO) program for trips in the non-ADA service area.



Peak Demand Overflow (PDO)


Safety net service in times of high demand

- Single Seat Taxi Ride
- Ambulatory Trips
- During Peak travel times
- Outside of the federal ADA Service Area





Peak Demand Overflow History



Supplemental Service Pilot Overview

- Service provided by medical assistance (MA) providers
- May be a shared ride
- Can accommodate both ambulatory and nonambulatory riders
- First door through door service
- Customers can chose between 2-3 providers
- Customers could be denied service if MA providers don't have capacity
- Customer pays \$3.00 fare
- Only rides outside of the federal ADA Service Area are eligible
