## **Business Item**

- 1) Approve recommendation for a fare adjustment on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017
- 2) Directs staff to report back by end-of-year 2017 on recommendations that:
  - a. Looks at options for determine when future fare adjustments should be considered
  - b. Includes looking at creating a sustainable funding structure focused on ridership growth and equity across the region
  - Looks at how to mitigate future increases for persons of color; low income communities; and youth, seniors and persons with disabilities

## 2017 Fare Change Goals

- Generate Additional Fare Revenues Increase revenues across all modes and service (Metro Transit, regional and contract service, Metro Mobility and Transit Link) while minimizing any ridership impacts
- Promote Equity Price fares so that they account for an equitable portion of operating costs and reflect the ability of customers to pay
- Simplify Make the fare structure easier to use and understand

#### Success Factors Include:

- Ensure all residents and communities are partners in the decision making process
- Find ways to mitigate the impact of increased fares on those that are most transit reliant
- Simplify the "how to pay" question
