Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include funding for three "Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Persons with Disabilities" projects.

Background

MnDOT was awarded funding from Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310's Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Persons with Disabilities program, which is funded by FTA through MnDOT's Office of Transit. The selection of these projects is done through grant applications submitted to MnDOT. The timing of final project selection is not compatible with the FTA grant application deadlines, which will need to be met in order to execute grant contracts for calendar year 2019.

Rationale

The Transportation Advisory Board approves formal amendments to the TIP and the Metropolitan Council concurs with the action of the TAB. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and state funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis. This TIP amendment is using the streamlined process adopted by TAB on April 19, 2014.

Thrive Lens Analysis
